Some years ago I attended a fundraising event for a Christian organization, and the guest speaker was a well-known personality who had given his life to Jesus Christ. Unfortunately, he seemed to have more to say about his own importance and his accomplishments than he shared about what Jesus Christ had done in his life.

We need to be very careful that Jesus does not get buried in our religious resumes. Jesus Christ must be the theme and topic of our lives. He shouldn't get obscured or clouded over, or be relegated to a brief acknowledgement.

That's why the emphasis in Galatians chapter 6 verses 12 through 14 is so very important for us to understand and embrace. Listen to these words; “Those who desire to make a good showing in the flesh try to compel you to be circumcised simply that they may not be persecuted for the cross of Christ. For those who are circumcised do not even keep the law themselves but they desire to have you circumcised that they may boast in your flesh. But may it never be that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world.”

Now, Paul's primary emphasis is talking about those people who were adding to the Gospel saying that you had to keep the law or go through the rituals of the law. But Paul says, “No, the only thing that makes me significant, the only thing that makes me really important is the cross work of Jesus Christ. My significance is found in Christ and not in my accomplishments.”

Here's what I want you to remember today. Don't be hesitant to talk about what God through Christ has done for you. Let's just make sure that people know that God did it.
