Some time ago two Christians approached me. They didn't know I was a believer, so they started witnessing to me. I played along. I asked them what I had to do to become a Christian. Sadly, their answers weren't very clear. It was a little embarrassing. I also felt guilty for setting them up. So I told them that I was a Christian, and we had a good laugh and a great time of fellowship. That experience has haunted me through the years. Even though we know Christ, we shouldn't make the assumption we can clearly communicate the Gospel message.

In contrast, toward the end of Acts chapter 26, the Apostle Paul is testifying before King Agrippa. Acts chapter 26, verses 22 and 23 says, “To this day I have had the help that comes from God, and so I stand here testifying both to small and great, saying nothing but what the prophets and Moses said would come to pass: that the Christ must suffer and that, by being the first to rise from the dead, he would proclaim light both to our people and to the Gentiles.”

Paul's life is on the line, yet he stands before this king and says, “Look, the most important thing for me to tell you today is that Jesus Christ the Son of God came to this world, died on the cross in your place, for your sin, rose again from the dead to confirm that He was who He said He was, and this message has to be proclaimed.”

Here's what I want you to remember today. If you don't know how to share the Gospel clearly or you're uncertain about it, get some help. There are plenty of materials available. Then ask God to use you to share this great news with all of those with whom you come in contact.
