# "Polar Opposites"

In film and television, a common stock element is to pair two characters who are completely opposite of each other. Examples include the "Odd Couple" "Buzz and Woody" and Buddy cop theme fare. Viewers are drawn to these presentations because the difference between them are so stark (different ethnicities, difference in size, difference in intelligence etc.). Sometimes the opposite characters serve as foils. Biblical authors do the equivalent by placing characters close together (not always physically intersecting) so that you the reader see the major differences between them and then draw valuable insights.

1. Easy recognizable ones – David and Goliath, Mordechai and Haman

## 2. Rahab and Achan (book of Joshua)

Canaanite	Hebrew (tribe of Judah, the best)
Prostitute (disrespectable)	Respectable
Should have died, but survived and prospered	Should have prospered, but died
Her family and all she owned survived	His family and all he owned perished
Nation perishes	Nation prospers
Hides the spies from the king	Hides the loot from God and Joshua
Hides the spies on the roof	Hides the loot under his tent
Fears the God of Israel	Does not fear the God of Israel
Has only <i>heard</i> of God, yet believes	Has seen the acts of God, but disobeys
Her house survives, while the city is burned	His tent is burned
Cattle, sheep, and donkeys of Jericho perish	Cattle, sheep, and donkeys of Achan perish
She becomes like an Israelite and lives	He becomes like a Canaanite and dies

Does not believe in Jesus immediately	believes in Jesus immediately
