Avoiding Holiday Stress

Understand what is motivating your choices, both for activities and gift purchases. Choose to live within your means. Instead of charging gifts on credit cards that could fuel January depression, use your creativity to make unique gifts—food, crafts, etc.

Neglect the tyranny of the urgent—learn to say no. Neglect self-pity, too: if you're feeling lonely, invite one or two people for a meaningful celebration at your home.

Stop *reacting* to cultural, family or other expectations and *respond* based on truth. Love family members with Christ's love instead of expecting them to meet your needs.

Take time to rest, rejoice, trust, talk—and breathe! Spend time outdoors, listen to Christmas music, go to a museum, or take an online tour of the world's best vacation spots.

Remember the reason for this season. Set traditions that matter for eternity.

Evaluate your emotional, physical, mental and spiritual responses to life's stressors. Maintain a balanced lifestyle, including time for rest—and healthy eating (as much as possible!).

Simplify your life; let go of useless baggage.

Set realistic boundaries for yourself and for those invited to your home.

Choose to Live a Balanced Life
